

# Country Match Intelligence Brief

A practical shortlist based on household budget, healthcare, family unity, lawful-stay practicality, schooling, pets, infrastructure, and proximity needs.

## EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

### OVERALL PATTERN

The strongest pattern is a split shortlist: two European options with strong healthcare, stability, walkability, and family systems, plus one nearby North American option that better supports budget and return-home logistics. Each Fit Score is based on your questionnaire answers and FlagSeek's country-fit signals, not a universal ranking of country quality.

### WHY THESE COUNTRIES ROSE

BEST FIT 1

### Portugal

Fit Score: 4.9 / 5 flags

This is the cleanest overall fit because it balances budget realism, plausible longer-stay options for remote or passive-income households, strong private healthcare access, walkable towns and cities, mild climate, and comparatively strong family-dependent signals.

The strongest customer-specific point is the adult-disabled-dependent issue. The supplied country-fit signals indicate a comparatively clear framework for dependent disabled children beyond the ordinary minor-child category, subject to proof of relationship, disability, and dependency. BEST FIT 2

## Spain

Fit Score: 4.5 / 5 flags

This rises because of strong healthcare, safety, walkability, Mediterranean lifestyle, and a major hidden-pathway clue through your spouse's Spanish citizenship and passport. It is appealing, but the budget margin is thinner than Portugal and must be handled carefully.

The spouse connection is a meaningful planning clue, not an eligibility conclusion. It may be worth investigating for family-based residence, documentation, citizenship-related rights, or other Spain-specific routes, but it must be confirmed through official authorities, the relevant consulate, and qualified immigration counsel. BEST FIT 3

## Mexico

Fit Score: 4.1 / 5 flags

This is the strongest closer-to-home option because it supports affordability, United States time zones, easier return trips, Spanish-language fit, possible ancestry clues, and established expat infrastructure. It is not as uniform on safety, infrastructure, or dependent-rule certainty as the European options.

The proximity advantage is practical, not cosmetic. From the United States, return travel for a family emergency, medical need, temporary reset, or permanent move is generally more manageable than from Europe: shorter flights, similar time zones, lower shipping friction, and easier family visits. The grandparent connection is also a hidden-pathway clue worth investigating. ## STRATEGIC WILDCARD

# Albania

Fit Score: 4.1 / 5 flags

This may not be the obvious choice because it has weaker healthcare depth, less mature expat infrastructure, and more administrative uncertainty than the top matches. It is still worth noticing because it tests a different, lower-cost European hypothesis with coastal and mountain access, a warm social feel, and possible longer-stay options for remote or foreign-source income households. It should not be treated as a serious option until healthcare, medication continuity, dependent-residence treatment, schooling, infrastructure, and pet rules are verified.

## FIT SIGNALS

- Very strong affordability signal, which matters because low cost of living was marked as an absolute must-have.
- Coastal and mountain lifestyle options align with your climate and landscape preferences.
- Possible legal way to stay longer than an ordinary tourist visit may exist for remote or foreign-source work, but family inclusion and renewal need verification.
- Warmer newcomer-access signals may support social entry, especially through recurring local routines, school, faith, volunteer, or neighborhood communities.

## WATCHPOINTS

- Political Stability Outlook: 2.8 / 5 flags. Governance, corruption, administrative predictability, and infrastructure capacity should be checked carefully before serious planning.
- Healthcare depth is a major watchpoint for cardiology, diabetes/endocrinology, skilled nursing, assisted living, hospice, and serious outpatient care.
- Adult-disabled-dependent rules are unresolved. Verify dependent age limits, disability exceptions, dependency evidence, renewal, permanent residence, insurance, and medical-admissibility treatment before relying on family unity.
- Medication continuity for insulin and lisinopril must be confirmed at the active-ingredient and prescribing level, including import documentation, local physician access, pharmacy availability, substitutes, refrigeration, and emergency replacement options.
